

AVIRETT, Archibald G. Bacon supplier

Five documents are found in the file for Archibald Averett in the National Archives files for Confederate Citizens. The endorsement on the Treasury note is found on two vouchers found in the file: a voucher dated April 13th, 1863, at Savannah, Georgia, for the supply of 1,778 pounds of bacon to Capt. George W. Long, ACS, for the sum of \$889.00, and another voucher for 95 pounds of bacon on June 12th, 1863, delivered to Capt. Archibald B. Seals, AQM, at Fort James, Georgia; these vouchers show reasonable matches, especially that for A. G. Avirett. The endorsement of the supplier on the Treasury note clearly reads "A. Avirett", but there are no civilians listed with that spelling in the National Archives files. It is probable that A. Avirett, Archibald Averett, and A. G. Avirett are the same supplier. The Interest Paid stamp at Savannah is consistent with the location of the supplier.
