

BLUM, A. & Brother Grain hauler



Twenty-seven documents are found in a file for “Blum Ara and Bro” in the National Archives files for Citizens, Business. The endorsement on the Treasury note reads “A. Blum & Bro, per Joe Blum.”

A. Blum & Brother were volume suppliers of hardware and goods such as nails, hatchets, osnaburgs, flax thread, blankets, bushels of corn, shirts, pants, drawers, socks, caps, shoes, bottles of ink, envelopes, quires of letter paper, and pens to Texas Quartermasters in Bonham, Galveston, Houston (Capt. E. C. Wharton, AQM), and Tyler. A. Blum & Brother posted a bond on May 6th, 1861, at Galveston for customs on goods received at Galveston, Texas. The vouchers in this file range in dates from October 25th, 1861 to September 30th, 1863. James Sorley and Charles Russell are also mentioned in connection with the firm of A. Blum & Brother.
