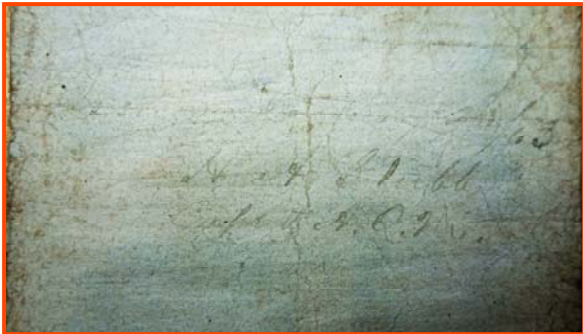


STUBBS, Henry A. Capt., AQM

The National Archives contain fourteen documents for Henry A. Stubbs in the files for Officers and seventeen documents are found for Henry A. Stubbs in the files for the State of Mississippi, Thirty-fourth Infantry. The 34th Mississippi Infantry was organized at Holly Springs, Mississippi in April 1862. The unit saw action in Mississippi, Kentucky, Tennessee, and Georgia. It served with the Army of Tennessee from Chickamauga to Atlanta, and surrendered at Bennett's House, Durham Station, North Carolina in 1865. The endorsement reads: "Issued January 26/63,
H A Stubbs, Capt & A. Q. M."

1862 Henry A. Stubbs enlisted as a Private at Ripley, Mississippi on February 26th, 1862, reporting to Company B "Tippah Rebels" of the 37th Regiment Mississippi Infantry. On May 21st, 1862 he

was appointed regimental quartermaster. He appears on an undated Shelbyville list of quartermasters reporting to the 37th Mississippi Regiment, Walthall's Brigade, Withers' Division, Polk's Corps, Army of Tennessee; the report noted that he was bonded.

1863 Stubbs was appointed as Capt. & AQM reporting to the 34th Mississippi Regiment on June 6th, 1863, taking rank retroactively to May 21st, and was confirmed on February 17th, 1864. A voucher for mules, a wagon, parts and tools dated August 20th, 1863 located Stubbs "near Chattanooga."

1864 Stubbs appears on a report of Staff and Acting Officers in Lee's Corps dated August 15th, 1864 at Atlanta, Georgia. This report noted that Stubbs served as a QM on the supply train of the Army of Tennessee and was detached from Anderson's Division.

1865 Stubbs surrendered on April 26th, 1865 as an officer in Brantley's Brigade, Hill's Division, Lee's Corps, Army of Tennessee, and was paroled at Greensboro, North Carolina on May 1st, 1865.

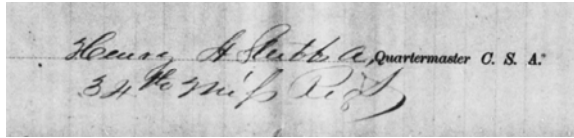

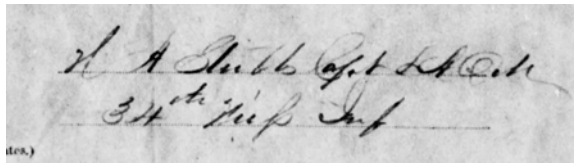
H. A. Stubbs' signatures from the National Archives.

The earliest known example, signed on August 20th, 1863, at a location near Chattanooga, as "A. Quartermaster, 34th Miss Regt."



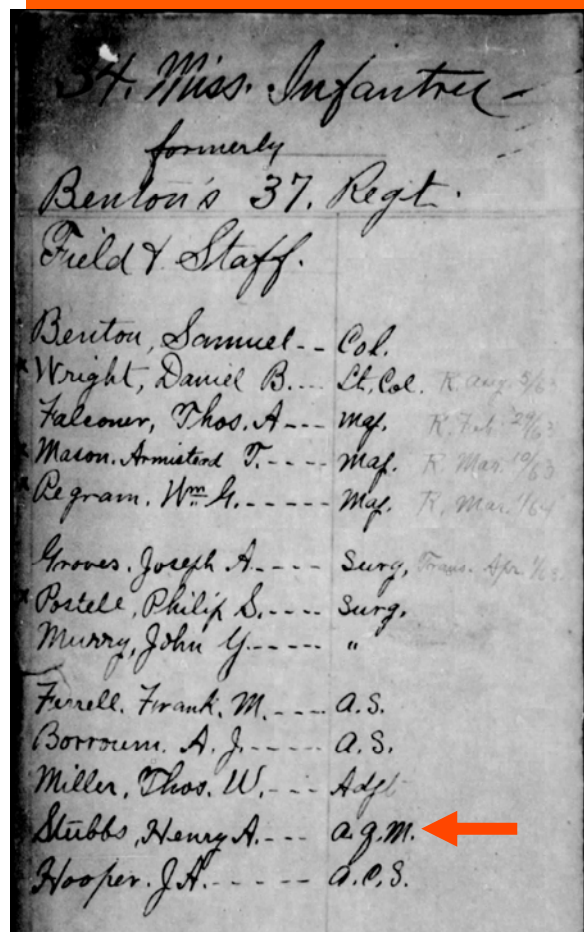
Handwritten signature: H. A. Stubbs, Quartermaster C. S. A.

✓ Memo. - Formerly Pvt. Co. B.
✓ Jan. & Feb., 1864. Rolls of Regt. to and including above date show him present. (Report, AO)
✓ Mar. 1 - Aug. 31, 1864. No record found.
Hood's cmd.
✓ Aug. 31, 1864. Insp. Report C18 shows him as capt. & Q.M. Supply Train, Hdqrs. A. of Tenn.
Walker's (J.A.) Cmd.
✓ Feb. 18, 1865. Capt. H.A. Stubbs, A.Q.M., is assigned to duty as Asst. to Maj. J.R. Braithwaite, Q.M. of Gen. Walker's cmd., on line of Richmond & Danville R.R. (S.O. 41(25), AGO)
✓ Memo. - May be a different man. The above assignment was made at the request of Gen. Lawton Feb. 16, 1865 (S-306, AGO)
Brantley's (W.F.) Cmd.
✓ April 26, 1865. Paroled as Capt. & A.Q.M. of Brantley's Brig., D.H. Hill's Div., Lee's Corps.
✓ Memo. - 10th Street Report shows him paroled May 1, 1865, at Greensboro, N.C. as of Brantley's Brig.
